

Clinical Practice syllabus (EMS 314)

Clinical practices will provide the student an opportunity to participate in the clinical/field environment and practice (under preceptor supervision) the skills they have demonstrated with proficiency in simulated education. They would be able to integrate theory and psychomotor skills developed to actual practice. There are 5 clinical practices distributed through the entire BS EMS Program. This will enable students to gradually build on their practical skills as they progress with class room and laboratory learning.

Course Requirements:

- 1- Mandatory attendance for training in field.
- 2- 25% of absence will dismiss from this course.
- 3- Write weekly **one** case report and upload it to **Fisdap within 72 hours** from your shift **“No more Extensions”**.
- 4- Weekly discussion with one of the faculty.
- 5- OSCE exam at the end of the semester. (Practical based – assessed by faculty based on skills practiced in this semester).

Objectives of the course:

1. Demonstrate proper use of advanced airway, ventilation and oxygenation devices.	1. Perform successfully advance airway skills in minimum 2 patients	1. ET Intubation-OR Evaluation form
2. Perform safe administration of medications through enteral and parenteral routes.	1. Establish minimum 10 parenteral routes (IV or IO) 2.
